

Disasters can devastate businesses and the lives of their staff in a matter of minutes.

Following the 2013 Blue Mountains bush fires the Blue Mountains Economic Enterprise forecast:

- Anticipated 518 jobs lost, with a predicted loss of over \$24.5 million in wages and salaries
- That's an anticipated 518 households and families that were affected, with knock-on effects to spending within the local economy

I just don't have time right now to prepare my business – I'll do it later


I can't afford to get insurance; it's just too expensive and a disaster will probably never happen

If a disaster stopped your business operating, how long could it survive without any income?

The price of disaster =

- hefty rebuilding costs
- + fixed costs
- + variable costs (WEEKLY)

Being insured or having financial planning in place for disasters is just good business



Following a disaster, it can take months to get your business back up and running **and some businesses never reopen at all!**

As a result of the 2013 Blue Mountains bush fires businesses lost:

- Stock
- Equipment
- Premises
- Fixtures
- Important data
- Electronics (e.g. tills, computers, mobile phones)

As a result of the 2017 Lismore floods:

1 in 6 businesses were yet to reopen after two months

Taking simple steps NOW to protect your vital business areas from disaster is just good business

If your business was shut for a month or more, how would that impact you, your staff and their livelihoods?

- How long could you afford to pay wages or allow staff to take accrued paid leave?
- How long before they would need to look elsewhere for employment?
- Where else might they get a job?
- What would be the impact on their families? Their kids?

Involving staff in disaster preparation and planning ways to keep them engaged following a disaster is just good business



Not preparing your business for disaster can have expensive consequences

BUSINESS A

- Unaware of flood risk to business
- No flood action plan in place
- Failed to move stock to safe location
- Business premises not designed to be flood resistant
- No post-flood recovery plan in place





Not preparing your business for disaster can have expensive consequences

- Business closure time:
Re-opened two months after
the flood water receded
- Financial impact:
Approximately **\$160,000**
in lost stock and new
shop fit-out



There are simple, effective steps other businesses in NSW are taking right now to protect themselves from disaster

BUSINESS B

- Aware of flood risk to business
- Flood action plan in place, including moving stock and staff requirements
- Stock moved to safe location
- Flood-resistant shop fit-out
- Post-flood recovery plan in place


